Call to Order

Chairman Mills called the meeting to order and welcomed all members and guests. Chairman Mills solicited public comments from the floor and requested comments to be limited to 3 minutes per speaker. No public comments. The October 8, 2019 PTAC Agenda was reviewed. No changes we made to the Agenda.

Approval of August 13, 2019 meeting minutes

The August 13, 2019 meeting minutes were reviewed. Mr. Howie Norwick made a motion to approve the August 13, 2019 meeting minutes. Mr. Moses Corbett seconded the motion. All PTAC members voted in approval of the meeting minutes for August 13, 2019.

Link Transit Operations Report

Mr. Killebrew gave a brief overview of the Link Transit Operations report to PTAC. Mr. Killebrew presented a Certificate of Appreciation to be given to Mr. Bromilow for the many years he served as PTAC Chairman and requested each PTAC member present sign the certificate. Mr. Killebrew said along with the certificate, Mr. Bromilow will be given a City of Burlington coffee mug. Mr. Killebrew expressed the importance in making sure we thanked Mr. Bromilow for his time served on the board. Mr. Killebrew

also shared the collages the ACC Dillingham students made for Link staff; sharing their memorable experiences they had on the Link Transit buses during Fare Free week.

Mr. Killebrew stated that this year staff has seen a 19% increase in ridership and overall the system is doing really well. Mr. Killebrew said just ¾ into the 2019 year and already had 76,216 riders (January to September). Mr. Killebrew also shared the fixed route has averaged 8,468 passengers per month.

PTAC members expressed their goals of local transit services being able to coordinate better for shared passengers. Mr. Killebrew agreed in saying that is one reason Link Transit has started accepting PART transfer cards; unfortunately though the PART system is unable to accept Link Transit transfer cards. Mr. Carter felt that was a topic that needed to be brought up during a PART meeting. Mr. Killebrew said Link Transit offers Regional Fare cards but by the end of December PART will no longer be accepting those types of fares due to the fact that PART is in the process of switching over to the all-electronic touch pass. Mr. Killebrew said he didn't see there being anything PART could do, it is all technology based. Mr. Killebrew said this is where Link Transit is going to have to make the decision to go with Touch pass smart card and be able to work with other transits regionally or continue using the Regional fare magnetic strip cards. Mr. Carter questioned the cost involved in switching to the Touch pass smart card. Mr. Killebrew said the cost would be around \$4,000 per bus not including service fees.

Mr. Mills questioned if the increase of ridership was due to the extension of hours. Mr. Killebrew said that could be one reason because with the hours being longer more people are able to get a ride to and from work now. Mr. Killebrew said there is really no way to track if this is the reason more people are riding but there has been a significant increase of ridership during the extension of hours. Mr. Mills said during a presentation he attended a surveyed showed that the transit systems that had bus shelters had substantial increases in ridership compared to areas that did not offer many bus shelters. Mr. Mills questioned what the schedule was for the upcoming Link Transit bus shelter installs. Mr. Killebrew said there should be two more bus shelters installed by December 2019. Mr. Killebrew explained two shelter installs just completed the engineering process and there are three more in the engineering planning phase. Mr. Killebrew said the amenities offered with bus shelters such as lights, a bench, an enclosure, attracts passengers; shelters typically make passengers feel safer. Mr. Killebrew said with the way the process is going now there should be 10 fully installed bus shelter along the Link Transit system by June 2020. Mr. Killebrew said the average cost per shelter is around \$8,000.

So far this year compared to last year the Link Transit system has shown an increase in ridership.

Increases in ridership 2019:

- Blue route 13.91%
- Red route 30%
- Orange route 28%
- Green route 1 to 1.5% decrease
- Purple route 16%

Mr. Killebrew said this year Link Transit fixed route is averaging 399 riders per day. Link Paratransit is averaging 20 riders per day showing an 8% increase from last year.

Mr. Killebrew said Link Transit has registered to participate in the Christmas parade this year. Mr. Killebrew said Link Transit staff will drive a Link bus during the parade just like in the past years. Mr. Killebrew said Transdev drivers and supervisors have really enjoyed participating in this event in the past. Mr. Killebrew said this year Link Transit Admin, Carley Maynard has selected a unique giveaway to pass out to people during the parade. Ms. Maynard presented a sample of the giveaway product to the PTAC members; the walking pet reindeer (the Link Transit logo will be displayed on one side of the reindeer). The PTAC members gave positive feedback to the parade giveaway idea. Mr. Mills questioned who would be on the bus during the parade. Mr. Killebrew said mostly like it will be Link Transit driver Bruce, he is the one that has driven the bus during the parade the past few years and also other special events Link Transit has participated in. Mr. Killebrew said the supervisor on duty will more than likely be Rena. Mr. Killebrew said the idea is to also decorate the bus for Christmas with a wreath on the front of the bus and some vinyl decals on the windows such as reindeer and possibly a snowman inflatable on the inside near the door.

Mr. Killebrew reminded PTAC about the resolution that was signed last year allowing Fare Free Day November 5th for Election Day. Mr. Killebrew shared that Link Transit went through the process of its first Comprehensive review in August 2019; overall went well, very simple issues that staff can correct and get it back to FTA. Mr. Killebrew said the Comprehensive review process for Link Transit should be complete by January 2020.

Other Business

Ms. McBane questioned the ridership numbers since the extension of hours. Mr. Killebrew said from January 2019 - September 2019, 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM, Link Transit

had 4, 039 riders. Mr. Mills questioned what the long range plan is for Link Transit. Mr. Mills said it has been mentioned about a new place for Link Transit to board. Mr. Killebrew said a transfer center has been in discussion for Link Transit but it does require a feasibility study to be done. Mr. Killebrew said the study requires someone to come in look over all of Link Transit's routes and the area it serves, figure out the needs for Link Transit, what type of building would be needed and staff would need to then apply for grants.






