### Link Transit to Reinstate Fares on December 18, 2023

**Burlington, NC** – Starting December 18, 2023, Link Transit will reinstate a fare structure for its fixed routes and paratransit services. The decision was made in response to the end of pandemic-related protocols.

The new fare structure is:
