Those interested in wanting to use Link Transit to the polls can visit the Alamance County Board of Elections website at https://www.alamance-nc.com/elections/sample-page/precinct-polling-places/ to see where the polling locations are and by using Link Transit's trip planner on www.linktransit.org or through the Transit or Moovit app, you can plan your trip to the polls! Passengers can also get fairly close to the Alamance County Board of Elections Office at 1128 S Main St, Graham by getting off the bus at the PART Graham Park and Ride Lot and walking ½ mile to the office.

"It is essential that everyone has the ability to perform their civic duty and cast their ballot," said John Andoh, Transit Manager for Link Transit. "No one should be denied their right to vote simply because they can't afford a ride. Free public transportation on election day will help by providing access to those who may not have transportation and help ensure that everyone can participate in our democracy."
