Link Transit Partnership with Alamance Community College for Free Rides

Burlington, NC – On Saturday, February 1, 2025 [Alamance Community College](#) (ACC) and Link Transit will start a new partnership that allows ACC affiliates such as students, employees and faculty members to ride Link Transit free by showing their ID card to the bus driver. [The Alamance Community College Foundation](#) will reimburse each passenger trip back to Link Transit at the current fare. This partnership is intended to increase access to ACC affiliates for travel throughout the Burlington-Graham urbanized area.

This funding is another expansion of a partnership that Link Transit had in place with ACC since 2016, when ACC started contributing to the Orange Route 2 service connecting Burlington, ACC Dillingham Campus, Alamance County Office Building and Courthouse and the ACC Main Campus.

“We are committed to removing barriers to education and opportunity. This partnership with Link Transit ensures that our students, faculty, and staff have greater access to reliable transportation, making it easier to pursue their academic and professional goals.
